SC 18.11.4	IT Business Case
	A memo was presented from the WASSTB CEO, as she had presented to the Board of
	Anglican Care, outlining the outcomes from an IT system review that took place in
	December 2017, identifying several risks and inefficiencies. As a result of this review, the
	diocese and ACW set up a joint project to scope the replacement of our operating

environment with the introduction of new software to better manage finance, HR, H&S, fundraising and business intelligence.

An independent IT project manager, Todd Goggin, investigated software options and presented them to the project team. The project team have not yet gathered enough information to be able to make the final decision on the project as a whole. The recommendations as to how to progress the project have now been presented to both the ACW board and Standing Committee for approval.

ACW have agreed to and now approval is sought from the Standing Committee for an IT project steering committee consisting of Lucy Laitinen, Colleen Kaye, Todd Goggin, Jules Morgan and Joanne Morris, to select vendors to implement the operating environment and software upgrade and replacement of hardware.

The Bishop thanked Todd. Todd left the meeting at 12.20pm.

Resolved:

- i) That the Standing Committee delegate authority to the IT project steering committee to select vendors to implement the operating environment and software upgrade and replacement of hardware.
- ii) That the Standing Committee approve a total maximum CAPEX expenditure of \$525k by both the diocese of Waiapu and ACW for the initial set up costs, and \$160k for ongoing yearly operating costs.
- iii) The final apportioning of costs to the diocese of Waiapu and ACW will be determined after the costs are finalised and will be treated separately.
- iv) The Diocesan Registrar will regularly report back to the Board on project progress

The meeting adjourned for lunch at 12.30pm and re-convened at 1.17pm

Finance Team Manager, Tracey O'Shaughnessy, was invited to join the meeting at 1.58pm to present the financial reports.

Financial Report for the Diocese to 30 September 2018. Financial Narrative – 30 September 2018 Parish Financial Health Sheet Draft budget for 2019

Points of note:

- The Diocese is projecting a \$594k surplus against a budgeted surplus of \$106k
- The major variance to budget for revenue is in the administration area and relates to the administration fees received. An administration fee is charged to WBDT at 1% of the portfolio values and the Diocese receives a proportion of this. As the proceeds from the sale of the rest homes for ACW was deposited into the permanent fund with WBDT, the administration fee to the Diocese from WBDT to 30/9/18 was higher than original budget.
- The administration area also has variances year to date relating to the operational overheads and these are \$80,000 up on budget. These are mainly in the following areas where additional costs have been incurred as the true cost of the shared services team is recorded, photo copying, stationary, and project work.

The Finance Manager confirmed that the health sheet will be updated to include the parish budget column to enable comparisons to the actuals year to date surplus.

Letter from Archbishop Philip Richardson regarding the Tauranga Moana Apology

The Bishop presented a letter to the Standing Committee from Archbishop Philip Richardson regarding the apology around the Tauranga land matters and the estimated hospitality costs for hosting the apology on the 1st December 2018. The letter asked that the Diocese of Waiapu to contribute towards the cost of hosting.

Letter from Holy Trinity Tauranga re GS Motion 14

The Registrar presented a letter dated 21 September 2018 from Donald G Carter on behalf of the Tauranga Parish requesting to convey a motion that was passed at the Annual General Meeting of the Holy Trinity Tauranga Parish held on Wednesday 23rd May 2018. As part of motion 14, the congregation considers itself to be an appropriate party to be involved in the restorative justice process.

St Luke's Development Proposal

held between Omokoroa Parish Council and UCANZ partners to discuss the issues the parish have with their current structure.
